## **CONSULTING ENGINEERS SOUTH AFRICA SUPPORTS MINISTER**

Consulting Engineers South Africa (CESA) representing 460 member firms employing in excess of 21000 staff members, fully supports the Minister of Higher Education and Training in applying for the Construction SETA (CETA) to be placed under Administration in full support of other established built environment professional bodies and employer organisations that include Master Builders South Africa (MBSA) and the South African Federation of Civil Engineering Contractors (SAFCEC). CESA's support stems from the severe lack of service to the Construction Sector based on feedback from their member firms who are both CETA clients and contributors. Graham Pirie, CEO of CESA states, "The needs of professional organisations representing business in the built environment have been totally neglected over the last 11 or so years and we as an organisation are looking for a resolution to this untenable situation".

CESA has been reliably informed that the Construction SETA (CETA) had recently initiated a process for applying for an interdict against the Minister for Higher Education and Training to prevent the CETA from being placed under administration. This follows letters issued by the Department in May 2010 to four SETAs, including CETA, regarding possible appointment of administrators to manage their affairs. CESA together with other established built environment professional bodies and employer organisations is on record supporting the appointment of an administrator and has assured the Minister of Higher Education and Training of their full co-operation and assistance in addressing the shortcomings at CETA.

Despite the fact that CETA achieved an unqualified audit in 2010, the first in several years, many issues in connection with weak financial administration, poor learnership management and accreditation of training providers are evidence of ongoing management ineffectiveness which is not conducive to the promotion of training in the construction industry.
