

EXTRINSIC FACTORS

BUDGET – Share of the Fiscal Pie (Mid Term Budget 2016):

- Those who need work
- Those who want to study
- Those who seek opportunities in their careers or businesses, and for their families,
- Those who dream of greatness in the arts, in sport, as builders or teachers, in business or in public service.



EXTRINSIC FACTORS

BUDGET – Share of the Fiscal Pie (Historical and Long Term):

- Our economic growth will be just 0.5 per cent this year, rising to 1.7 per cent in 2017.
- Debt is projected to stabilise at just less than 48 per cent of GDP.
- Infrastructure investment, mainly in energy, transport and telecommunications, will amount to over R900 billion over the next three years.



EXTRINSIC FACTORS

BUDGET – Share of the Fiscal Pie (Historical and Long Term):

"Our central message is that stable and sustainable public finances, alongside economic reforms and a transparent monetary policy, can support a return to the higher growth rates needed to achieve the National Development Plan's goals."



EXTRINSIC FACTORS

BUDGET – Share of the Fiscal Pie (Future Focus):

What the Minister's message translated to in terms of 'inclusivity':

- The quality of education,
- The pace and pattern of urbanisation and housing development,
- Industrial development and the expansion of employment, trade and commerce,









Africa lacks infrastructure:


- THE INFRASTRUCTURE NEED OF SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA EXCEEDS US \$93 BILLION

 ANNUALLY OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS. (AICD) So does the rest of the world
- FINANCING GAP OF MORE THAN US \$50 BILLION USA needs \$X trillion to meet
 infrastructure needs
- THE POOR STATE OF INFRASTRUCTURE IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA CUTS NATIONAL
 ECONOMIC GROWTH BY TWO PERCENTAGE POINTS EVERY YEAR AND REDUCES
 PRODUCTIVITY BY AS MUCH AS 40 PER CENT More visible because Africa is
 underdeveloped, but fastest growing economies ARE in Africa e.g. Ivory Coast



INTRINSIC FACTORS

Africa lacks infrastructure – State of South Africa's Infrastructure



The focused investment over the past five years has resulted in more new infrastructure and an improvement in the condition of some existing assets. However, infrastructure at municipal level remains poor and is deteriorating in many places. Further, the resilience of all new and previously existing infrastructure is questionable without a much improved commitment to maintenance.



C – The infrastructure condition is acceptable although stressed at peak periods. It will need investment in the current Medium term Expenditure Framework period to avoid serious deficiencies.





INTRINSIC FACTORS

INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY – Technology:

- Technology helps where there are limited resources
- For improved research (e.g. understand behaviour of infrastructure)
- Defer Maintenance and used budgets at areas required the most (e.g. SHMs)
- Make life easier (e.g. Drawing and Designing tools)

INTRINSIC FACTORS

INNOVATION AND TECHNOLOGY – Internal politics:

- Snobbishness (Hierarchy: Engineer Technologist Technician): No Hegemony
- Categorisation Mess up Overlap of work: No clear lines of demarcation
- Transformation One of slowest sectors
- Ratio of registered person to citizen still very low.
