After the customary 5 penalties each, the teams could still not be separated, and a sudden-death shootout ensued where ultimately AURECON emerged victorious.

Congratulations to AURECON for being crowned 2017 champions and to Naidu Consulting for playing their part in a thrilling final and for their vociferous support throughout the event.

"Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." – Nelson Mandela

Often the most common question from high school students is: "Why do we have to learn maths? When will it even matter?". High school students perceive maths as difficult and boring and do not appreciate the fact that many challenging and rewarding careers – not just engineering – demand a strong mathematical ability.



The Young Einsteins programme is a maths workshop to assist disadvantaged grade 11 learners. The workshops take place on the third Saturday of every month at Margot Fonteyn Secondary School in Marianhill near Durban. The programme assists on average a total 150 learners. Volunteers from the CESA member firms make up the team of teachers, who sacrifice 3 hours of their Saturday mornings to take students through Grade 11 maths problems.





Volunteers also put together a monthly stationery and snack pack for the learners.

The relevance of maths beyond high school is often dismissed. The programme aims to give students a clearer insight into why numeracy as well as quantitative and statistical understanding is so important.

As part of CESA-YPF's mandate to promote the engineering profession to learners, the August maths workshop will devote an entire hour to an "engineering career talk" with a representative from UKZN.

The programme assists high school students to think critically and to understand the mathematical processes – changing maths habits for a brighter future.
