WHAT HAS BOTSWANA DONE?

- PILLAR 1: SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT
 - Rural electrification (the 100 villages project by Botswana Power Corporation).
 - Improved connectivity in the region. The Kazungula bridge project (due for completion in 2020) between Botswana and Zambia.
 - North South Water Carrier project which transfers water from North of Botswana to South, which is on the third phase, due for completion in 2020.
- PILLAR 1: SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENT
 - Introduction of the Environmental Act which talks to the consideration of environmental impacts in all developments



KAZUNGULA BRIDGE

- Botswana and Zambia partnership
- One stop border post
- Improved processing border processing from 5days to 5hours







NORTH-SOUTH CARRIER WATER PROJECT

- Transfer of water from North to South of Botswana including the capital city.
- The northern part of the country receives more rainfall than the south. The biggest dams are therefore located in the north.
