For the first time this year, the YPF session for the conference was not a parallel session, but an Open Forum on the Tuesday attended by the entire conference delegation. The Open Forum had the following speakers:

- 1. Andrew Steeves, Canada who spoke about Helping YPs align themselves with their personal strengths (ie. technical vs. Management vs marketing, etc.) to meet their career goals and the company's needs.
- 2. Manoochehr Azizi, Iran who reported on the results of a YP survey that asked questions regarding what YPs would like to see in a company with respect to developing their skills, and how companies can provide the necessary resources and environment for YP development. What this space for a full report on the results which the FIDIC YPF is working on!
- 3. Selena Wilson, YPFSC who gave examples of how YPGs around the world are providing valuable development opportunities to YPs outside their companies through training seminars, YP programs at conferences, technical tours, volunteer efforts in the community, mentor ship program, etc. She discussed why these groups are so important for YP development, development of companies, and development of MOs and FIDIC. Provide a brief introduction of the SC, what we offer YPs, and how we can assist/promote the start of YP groups in MOs that currently do not have YPGs.
- 4. Richard Stump, USA who provided a YP perspective on Business Integrity. He also provided an update on the FIDIC pilot program of the Business Integrity Management System (BIMS), gain a perspective on what YPs think of business integrity and how learning BI skills it is a direct importance to the future development of companies.
- 5. Mr. Imai, Japan presented a YP development case study in Japan







SSI KNOWLEDGE FAIR

Young SSI in collaboration with YPF Gauteng South held a Knowledge Fair at SSI's Head Office in Woodmead, Johannesburg.

The following flagship projects were presented to the attending YPs:

The Blackburn Pedestrian Bridge – Presented by Jonah Ptak (Transport Engineer)

The Blackburn Pedestrian Bridge is Kwa-Zulu Natal's new landmark structure. With close to 3 km of walkway included, the 177.5 m long and 60 m tall cable stay bridge, the project is one of



SANRAL's community development projects intended to provide more than just a safe passage to work opportunities but also upliftment of the community through development of human capital.

The presentation covered the technical challenges, their solutions and the unique approach to community involvement that culminated in successful, on budget completion of one of the longest cable stay pedestrian bridges in Africa.

Ingula Pumped Storage Scheme – Presented by Ramolin Naidoo (Water Engineer)

Bedford Dam is a 49m high concrete faced rockfill dam (CFRD) with an 810m crest length forming the upper reservoir of the Ingula Pumped Storage Scheme.



The dam is part of the 1332 MW Ingula Pumped Storage Scheme, to be commissioned in 2014, which will go a long way to reducing load shedding in South Africa whilst enhancing economic growth. State of the art Computation Fluid Dynamic techniques were used for modelling the dam outlet to ensure that a sensitive wetland downstream of the dam is protected.

Medupi Power Station Site Visit

The CESA Limpopo YPF visited the Medupi site on the 25th May 2012, and approx. 20 people took part on the undertaking. It was exciting trip that was planned in a very short space of time.

Medupi is a greenfield coal fired power plant project, compromising of six units with a gross nominal capacity of 800MW each, resulting in a total capacity of 4800MW.

Construction activities commenced in 2007. The power station will be the fourth largest coal plant in the world, and will be the biggest dry-cooled power station in the world. The Medupi boiler house will stand approximately 130m high.

University of Cape Town Professional Registration Seminar

YPF WC hosted their annual Professional Registration workshop for candidates on 19 September at the University of Cape Town. The workshop was presented in two parallel sessions, accommodating Engineers in one session and Engineering Technicians and Technologists in the other. Johan Pienaar from ECSA addressed both groups about the application process and explained how the registration process works. He also highlighted the differences in the registration process between the different disciplines of engineering, eg. electrical, mechanical, civil etc.

Eng candidates must go through in order to register and the essays that they have to write. Both speakers brought across the message that candidates should have no reason to fear the process of registration.

Each group was also addressed by a recently successfully registered candidate who shared their personal experience during the process. Their message was clear: "Don't hesitate, get it done, it's worth it and it's nothing to be scared of at all."
