












Impact Footprint across the Rest of Africa (RoA)



This Programme has successfully contributed to an increasing number of learners undertaking studies in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) by giving them the opportunity to improve their results in Mathematics and Physical Science for acceptance into tertiary learning institutions.

- Improve Grade 12 Mathematics and Physical Science results of learners from disadvantaged communities.
- Improve the aptitude of learners in Maths and Science, and to inspire, support, and encourage these learners to follow a career in the fields of Science, Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).

An innovative intervention necessitated by the high failure rate in Maths and Science in the Eastern Cape and the country at large. It is a second chance for matric learners, targeting learners with poor matric results in Maths and Science. The intervention is focused on learners from disadvantaged communities and is an enabler for access to higher education. It is anchored on partnership with likeminded organisations.
