- ◆ Section 217 of the Constitution **Cost-effective not Least Cost!**
- ◆ Total Cost of Ownership Cheap puts Lives at Stake
- ◆ 70% of member companies are more than 50% black-owned with 30% being women owned

"What is the ultimate cost of pursuing the least cost route in particular when procuring infrastructure?"

QUALITY AND COST

- Cheap simply does not last and puts lives at stake
- Inadequate design only equates to 2% of the lifecycle cost of a project.
- MUST CURTAIL inadequate supply chain and procurement management.
- MUST implement relevant financial management capacity building initiatives.
- Root out corruption and fraud across SA!


